Please be specific as to test type) and the time frame required (before or after arrival).	 All students hosted in Belgium have to hold a negative COVID-19 test upon arrival. We recommend a PCR test. The test cannot be older than one week (7 days). All students have to fill in an online form within 48h prior to arrival in Belgium. They have to register a mobile phone number to receive a confirmation code. Upon correct registration, they will receive a QR Code. They will have to show it beforeboarding. https://travel.info-coronavirus.be/ After submitting the form, a score will be automatically calculated to assess the degree of risk taken in their home country and this score will be used to assess the need to be tested and isolated upon their arrival in Belgium. If they're at high risk, they will receive a text message requesting a Covid-test and/or a 10 days quarantine upon arrival in Belgium. The PCR test costs 46,81€ and is at their expense. Exception to this rule: swimming pools are open though a reservation needs to be made. Homeworking is mandatory if possible. All shops are open. Night shops are open until 10.00 pm. Restaurants and bars are closed. You can order take away until 10.00pm. Markets and small fairs are open but you can't eat or drink there. Flea markets and Christmas markets are not allowed.
